

SPAIN AND MEXICO: REFERENCE WORKS FOR A GENEALOGIST

What reference works would a genealogist specializing in research in Spain or Mexico have in his personal library? That question was posed recently by the editor of a book on professional genealogists published by Genealogical Publishing Company Baltimore , Maryland. The following lists were prepared in response to that question. Most can be obtained in print, although a couple, such as the *Guia de la Iglesia en España* may have to be photocopied. Others such as the Madoz dictionary may, due to cost (\$400 for the 16 volumes in the facsimile edition), have to be ordered on indefinite loan at a local Family History Center. Many are now available on line as well. In addition to these country wide materials regional histories, geographical dictionaries and archival guides, inventories and indexes should be obtained

LOCATING RECORDS IN SPAIN AND LATIN AMERICA

USUALLY START WITH PARISH OR CIVIL REGISTRATION RECORDS. THESE ARE FOUND IN THE FOLLOWING WAY:

1. CHECK THE FHLC UNDER THE NAME OF THE PLACE.

There are more films for Mexico than any other country. Parish records have been filmed in over 1/3 of the Catholic Church dioceses in Spain AND in over 2/3 of other Latin American countries.

2. IF NOT FOUND, DETERMINE IF THE PLACE IS A PARISH, MUNICIPALITY, RANCH, OR HAMLET.

SPANISH DIVISIONS: POLITICAL- MUNICIPALIDAD, PROVINCIA, REGION
ECCLESIASTICAL-PARROQUIA, ARCIPRESTAZGO, DIOCESIS

- b. www.pueblos-espana.org This website is country specific. It is only good for research in Spain. The website gives more detail than just maps. Some towns have brief histories, information on local monuments, the city hall, and local holidays

4) Gazetteers—Geographic Dictionaries

a) Gazetteers and Geographic Dictionaries are nearly synonymous. In my experience geographic dictionaries contain more detail about localities than most gazetteers. This is important because geographic dictionaries normally give political jurisdictions which will direct you to the correct records.

 - iii. www.ancestry.com Now has parish records for nine Mexican parishes situated along the US and Mexico border. The parishes are Matamoros, Agualequas, Mier, Sabinas Hidalgo, Vallecillo, Cadereyta, Camargo, Cerralvo, and Guerrero. Years covered are 1751-1880.

There are thousands of searchable names in the database right now, and more are added frequently. This is also a great opportunity to become a volunteer extractor.

ARCHIVAL REFERENCE MATERIALS

Accessing records in the archives discussed most often requires on site research in Southern Europe. Whether planning a research trip or hiring a researcher, one needs to know as much as possible about the archives that exist and the records they contain. Numerous books have been published to aid the researchers' access to archival records, with many more existing in the archives in the form of unpublished manuscripts and card catalogs.

Archival reference works can be divided into four categories: guides, inventories, indexes and catalogs.

A guide may cover several archives or a single archive or even a large section of a single archive, describing the collections of the archive(s) in broad strokes, section by section. Generally the collection description is brief, providing only a single title, phrase or paragraph as to content with dates of coverage and in some cases the general signature or call number of items in the section. The better guides also provide information about the institution(s) that created the particular records, assisting the reader to understand and more effectively use them.

An inventory generally provides a description with sufficient detail so that a researcher may request a specific file, bundle, or document. This is never a name by name list of people and places in the documents. Generally, the inventory is based upon the smallest unit the archive uses for organization of documents in that particular section, such as case files, documents produced in a particular time period, bound volumes or individual documents. In most cases the organization was determined, not by the archive currently holding the material, but by the institution or organization which generated the material. For example, judicial court or personnel records are usually by case file, notarial records by annual volumes, and correspondence by chronological period such as month or year.

Alphabetical indexes are rare. Most of the indexes found at the back of Southern European books are little more than tables of content. On occasion when an inventory is of sufficient detail there may be an alphabetical index of document descriptions listed at the back, but even these are exceptional.

Catalogs are a fourth category of archival access materials. Unfortunately, the word has often been used in a broad sense in lieu of inventory, index or even guide. In its technical sense a catalog is a collection of entries that fully describe each and every document in a collection, much like a library catalog describes each and every book. Most such catalogs deal with a few selected documents or at most a subsection of an archives. Some, however, fully describe documents which appear in a thematic exposition drawn from one or more sections or even more than one archives in an exposition.
